# **Cross Text Passages**

## **Key Strategy:**

Understanding the **main idea/claim** of both passages and understanding the **relationship** between the two passages.

## **5 Common Types of Relationships:**

- Contradictory
- \*Yes but....
- \*No but...
- General/Specific
- Objective/Subjective

Use the "BUT" formula when the passages are similar OR the author of passage two does not completely contradict the author of passage 1

#### **STEPS:**

#### Step 1

#### **Read Passage 1:**

- What is the claim/main idea in 3-6 words.
- What is the tone?

## **Read Passage 2:**

• Answer the same two questions above

## Step 2

What is the relationship between the two paragraphs? (Think about this as you read passage 2)

## Step 3

If a "Yes, but..." or "No, but..." relationship, what is the **BUT**? (Must establish this before going to the question!)

## Step 4

Answer the question. Make sure to read carefully! Sometimes a question might say, "How would the Author of Passage 2 react to Passage 1?". And, other times the question might say, "How would the author of Passage 1 react to Passage 2?". The SAT likes to trick you! Thus, read carefully and slowly!
