- Thesis: The author's argument is developed through the author's use of evidence, rhetorical language, and structure.
  - o **Paragraph** #1 Evidence to support the claim
    - Quote/s as support:
    - Evidence
    - Evaluation of evidence
  - o **Paragraph** #2 Use of rhetoric to develop claim
    - Quote/s as support:
    - Analyze two rhetorical elements within the passage.
    - Why are they used and is it effective?
  - o **Paragraph #3** Structure
    - Analysis of the way the author structures his/her piece to establish the claim.
    - How does this structure help establish the tone?
    - Why is it important?

#### Outline #2 – (Use if author makes 3 MAIN POINTS)

- Thesis: The author builds his argument by explaining how "a', "b", and "c" support the "claim."
  - o **Paragraph** #1 point #1
    - Evidence
    - Rhetorical Device
    - Quote
    - Does the author use effectively?
  - o **Paragraph** #2 point #2 (Same as above)
  - o **Paragraph** #3 Point #3 (Same as above)

#### Outline #3 (Use if clear PROGRESSION) \*Careful not to plot summarize

- Thesis: The author builds his argument through the logos
  - **Paragraph** #1 first part of the essay
    - Author's supporting claim
    - Evidence
    - Rhetorical
    - Ouote
  - o **Paragraph #2 and #3** same support as above and how does the argument build

### **Outline #4 (Use if author's STYLE is prominent)**

- **Intro** Introduce topic and article. Provide claim. Thesis: *The author's argument is developed through the use of pathos, statistics, and other rhetorical devices.* 
  - o **Body Paragraph #1** Rhetorical Device #1
    - Explanation
