Phrase: Does not contain a subject/verb

Non-essential Clause: Contains a subject/verb BUT can't be a sentence because a word in the 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} box precedes (comes before) the subject/verb

Non-Essential Clause: subordinate clause or dependent clause Sentence: independent clause, essential clause
