16 Week SAT Study Plan

The following is a 16-week SAT study plan. Depending on when you begin your preparation, you may need to adjust this plan accordingly. The key to success is to start with a diagnostic score and then use resources like Khan Academy to build your skills and strategies. Avoid jumping into CollegeBoard practice exams before you're familiar with the content; focus first on learning the material. Watch the Khan video lessons, read through the accompanying materials that teach essential skills and strategies, and practice by answering questions while reviewing the detailed explanations for each answer. This approach will ensure a solid foundation before you attempt the official exams.

You must engage in Deliberate Practice throughout your preparation. Deliberate Practice means actively recognizing areas in which you need further improvement by completing more practice questions and identifying specific skills that require additional focus. After gaining this solid understanding of the content, you should then begin taking CollegeBoard Digital exams and working through the CollegeBoard Supplemental Questions. Practice, practice, and more practice is the path to SAT mastery.

Notes:

- 1. The number of available CollegeBoard Digital PSAT and SAT exams is limited, so it's crucial not to "waste" them by immediately taking test after test. Before diving into these exams, you must first focus on learning the strategies and building content knowledge via Khan Academy.
- 2. Even if you've already taken the PSAT, the CollegeBoard Digital PSAT exams offer valuable practice. These exams mirror the content, structure, and question types found on the SAT. Therefore, consider the two digital PSAT exams as additional SAT practice opportunities.
- All official CollegeBoard Digital Exams must be taken under timed, test-like conditions. Ensure you're in a quiet environment, with your phone put away, to replicate the actual testing experience.
- 4. Do not download the Official SAT Practice Exams and complete these exams on paper! On test day, the exam will only be available digitally. Additionally, the SAT is adaptive*, and paper exams do not reflect the adaptive nature of the test.

*Based on how students perform on the first module of the test, the second module will either be easier or more difficult.
